By fostering collaboration across sectors, disciplines, and communities, One Health promotes sustainable solutions to enhance well-being, protect ecosystems, and achieve global health equity.

•The One-Health approach is particularly critical for Africa, where human, animal, and ecosystem health are intricately linked. Challenges such as zoonotic diseases, food insecurity, and climate-induced health risks underscore the need for holistic strategies that break down silos between disciplines.

•Cape Verde, a Small Island Developing State (SIDS), exemplifies both the vulnerabilities and opportunities associated with climate change and health challenges. Despite its susceptibility to climate shocks, Cape Verde has made significant strides in healthcare, achieving a Universal Health Coverage (UHC) index of 80%1.

•The 2025 Africa Health Summit and Awards (AHAS) provides a unique platform to explore how the One-Health approach can address Africa's health and environmental challenges,

with Cape Verde as a backdrop for inspiration and collaboration.

- •Cape Verde, a stunning archipelago of 10 volcanic islands off the West African coast, is one of the Small Island Developing States (SIDS).
- With a population of around 600,000, it is both uniquely beautiful and increasingly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change. Despite these challenges, Cape Verde has made significant strides in strengthening its ecosystem and health systems.
- Cape Verde has achieved nearly 80% universal

health coverage index and boasts wellestablished healthcare facilities. However, there remains room to enhance specialized care and digital health services. The 2025 Africa Health Summit will provide a platform for collaboration, offering opportunities to partner with local stakeholders to further build resilience and strengthen healthcare systems.

 We are committed to advancing the global agenda for the sustainable development of small island states and Africa as a whole, through strategic collaboration with governments, policymakers, the private sector and NGOs.
